Among Chief Provost's many accomplishments in her distinguished career is her successful standup of CBP's Law Enforcement Officer/Agent Safety and Compliance Directorate (LESC), which is responsible for the development and articulation of all CBP use of force policies and provides the agency with comprehensive and operational Use of Force programs and training. Chief Provost spent her career promoting continual learning and served as an instructor for bike patrol units, firearms training, and post-academy law as a young field Agent. Her operational experience spans across four different Sectors inclusive of all four states that border Mexico. "We are thrilled to welcome Chief Provost as our new Advisory Board Chairman," said Lee Arevian, Border Security Expo Event Director. "Her vast experience and real-world knowledge of the evolving threats and challenges facing our borders will prove invaluable in helping us provide
